



East Milton Square Parking And Access Study

Location: East Milton Square bounded by the intersections of:

- Squantum Street and Granite Avenue to the north.
- Adams Street, Centre Street and Pleasant Street to the west.
- Adams Street, Beale Street and Stedman Street to the east.
- Boulevard Street and Granite Avenue to the south.

Goal: Increase access for all modes of transportation to East Milton Square, improve parking, knit the Square together by improving local connections over I-93, and foster the long-term business vitality of the area.



Outcome: Actionable plan for design and construction, approved by the Town of Milton that addresses the project goals.

Project timeline: Approximately one year – June 2010 to May 2011. Key dates include:

- Notice to proceed: May, 2010.
- Research to establish existing conditions: summer to early fall 2010.
- Development of alternatives: fall 2010 to early spring 2011.
- Submission of final report: May, 2011.

Project cost: \$150,000.

Citizen input: Your input to the project is solicited and appreciated and there will be opportunities for members of the public to offer their thoughts throughout the project. Both the project team and the Town of Milton believe that a project of this magnitude should be done with the community and not just for it. The project team is kicking off its work with the Business and Citizen's Advisory Committee (BCAC) appointed by the Milton Board of Selectmen in July 2010 and there will be three open public meetings over the course of the project.
